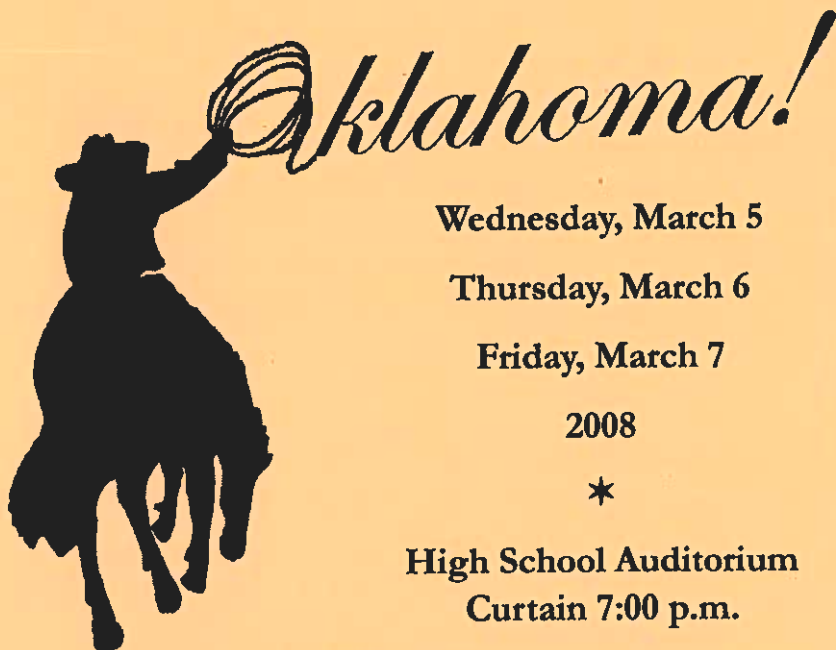

NOTES ABOUT THE PLAY

- *Oklahoma!* is the first musical play written by Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein II. The show opened on March 31, 1943, at the St. James Theatre in New York City, for a record-breaking 2,212 run; in the previous decade, no Broadway show had lasted more than 500 performances.
- In 1944, Rodgers and Hammerstein were awarded a Pulitzer Prize in the category of "Special Awards and Citations — Letters." A 1955 film adaptation won an Academy Award.
- Originally entitled *Away We Go*, the show was unique because it cast actors rather than singers (billing no stars), and because the first act featured Agnes de Mille's 15-minute "Dream Ballet" finale. It was her first time to choreograph a Broadway show.
- *Oklahoma!*, based upon Lynn Riggs's notable 1931 play *Green Grow the Lilacs*, continued the innovations of *Show Boat* and developed a "book musical" form intended to stir emotions rather than prompt gales of laughter.
- In 1953, the title song became the official state song of Oklahoma, the "Sooner State."
- 1993 brought a 50th Anniversary Tony Award, 2002 saw a 388-run at the George Gershwin Theatre, and in 2006 the all-female Takarazuka Revue performed the show in Japan.

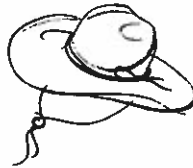
