Program Descriptions

College in High School (CHS)

Students will have the opportunity to earn dual enrollment SFU credits in the approved courses taught by the approved high school teachers. Students will apply for admission to SFU in April, and then register for the course(s) in May. Students will be billed \$58 per credit for the course in June and expected to pay by the end of July. Schedule changes (add and drop) can continue through September. Teachers will be invited to professional development opportunities with SFU. Students enrolled in CHS courses will be invited to an annual SFU CHS orientation day each September.

Career Development Series

Students will have the opportunity to earn dual enrollment SFU credits in the following online courses along with other high school students. Each course will be one semester long, and based on the SFU academic calendar. Fall 2020 courses will begin Monday, August 24, 2020 and conclude with a final exam during the week beginning December 7. Spring 2021 courses will begin Monday, January 11, 2021 and conclude with a final exam during the week beginning April 29.

The courses listed in the table will be offered only to students from a variety of high schools. This will form a rich learning environment with class projects and discussions involving the students with each other and the Saint Francis University professor in the online learning environment. The entire class of high school students will also come to campus in Loretto at least once during the semester for a full day of learning experiences.

The courses selected are intentionally chosen to allow high school students to explore different career paths, perhaps choosing one course from two areas of the three career paths. Alternatively, students already focused on one career path can proceed deeper in the career direction by taking both courses in that general area.

Students will apply for admission to SFU in April of 2020, register for the course(s) in May, be billed for each course in June, and expected to pay by the end of July. Schedule changes (add and drop) can continue through September for Fall 2020 courses and through January for Spring 2021 courses.

Billing for each CDS course will be at a discounted rate of \$200 per credit, for a total of \$600 per course, with no additional student or technical fees.
